MORE SCENES SUGGESTIONS for the first part: PADDINGTON AND THE "ZOMBIES"

• Paddington seems to be unsuccessfully looking for a home in London as in his first film (maybe we can recycle old film footage).

Every receptionist refuses him entrance in the Framestore buildings, because they are so overcrowded that they resemble scenes of a **zombie film**

- One scene could have Paddington looking with horror at one of our many street windows (Well's or Noels street) where Framestore employees are squashed against the glass and still somehow trying to make business calls and write on a laptops, having lunch, etc.
- Another scene could have our bear trying to open a door (maybe Well's Mews), which "explodes" leaving a sea of people falling on him and out on the street
- One receptionist may suggest Paddington would have more luck in the new opened Chicago or in the expanded LA and Montreal locations. The bear will shake his head thinking that he doesn't has enough marmalade reserves to travel that far.
- An employee with good intentions may still try to offer to Paddington a place in a drawer or under a table, making the poor bear run away more scared than before.



- Paddington finally wanders to Chancery Lane. When passing in front of nr 28 he hears some noise and peeks inside. Like in **Beauty and the Beast**, initially the building seems inhabited. 'But what is an old chandelier doing in a modern place like this?' thinks the bear (reference to Lumiere, who opened the door before coming back to idleness)
- Paddington later discovers that the music he heard from the street is coming from the boom box of a dancing baby Groot. Soon Rocket Racoon explains to our bear that they found this big building needlessly empty, so they made it their home, together with other creatures
- The first idea for making nr 28 a creature shelter may have come from Newt Scamander, who needed a free and big enough place where to keep his Fantastic Beast, while his luggage was being repaired after been damaged at Heatrow airport.
- Gecko (Geico) suggests to throw Paddington a party to make up for his hard day of wandering. Mog (Sainsbury's cat) makes himself cozy at Paddington's feet while he sits on his bag in the middle of the big hall and imagines an intimate marmalade party with friends

- Although, the party grows bigger and bigger, with an increasing number of walking and flying Framestore creatures and finally more and more Framestore employees start queuing to get inside
- Initially Paddington may use his famous disapproving bear stare on them, as to refuse the Framestore crowd entrance in retaliation, but finally he smiles and welcomes everyone with a jar of marmalade.
- The police would have already kicked out the "squatters" if it weren't for all the intimidating dragons and other Fantastic Beasts of different shapes and forms
- A couple of **young wizards** are dueling on the snowy terrace. The sparks from their wands make each snowflake crystallize into different and beautiful shapes
- A Chinese dragon from our VR rides will storm inside the massive entrance hall and push everyone to the top floor's terrace. Although, there is nothing to fear; he is not angry. He simply wants everyone to enjoy a firework display in celebration of FRAMESTORE's new era !
